The Standing Committee for Organists of the National Association of Pastoral Musicians (NPM) has developed this program to encourage high school and college age organists

- ❖ to become members of NPM and attend NPM conventions
- ❖ to participate in NPM Young Organist Master Classes;
- ❖ to encourage professional development and growth in the knowledge of church music;
- ❖ to serve as organists for Roman Catholic parishes.

NPM Young Organists Master Class Program

The National Association of Pastoral Musicians (NPM)

is a membership organization composed primarily of musicians, musician-liturgists, clergy, and other leaders of prayer devoted to serving the life and mission of the Church through fostering the art of musical liturgy in Catholic worshiping communities in the United States.

An NPM Convention is a national meeting (in odd-numbered years) or a regional meeting (in even-numbered years) of members and others who are interested in participating in the following:

- skill and educational workshops,
- recitals by renowned artists and ensembles,
- daily worship and plenum addresses,
- hymn festivals,
- music exhibits and showcases, and
- celebration of the Eucharist and other communal liturgies.

Organists have the opportunity to participate in the following:

- organist section meetings,
- organ crawls,
- Young Organist Master Classes,
- experiences of fine pipe organs,
- organ recitals,
- organ workshops, and
- sessions leading toward certification.

An Organ Master Class is an opportunity for selected organists to perform in a lesson-type setting with a critique given by a Master Teacher. Other participants have the opportunity to listen to these organists and the critiques.

NPM Young Organists Master Class Requirements

Students must submit an **audition compact disc or cassette tape** to be considered for the performance portion of the Young Organists Master Class. The audition CD or tape must contain music selections including hymns and organ literature as described below:

High School Students (ages 13–18)

- 1) Each candidate must play two hymns of his/her own choice with pedal in the correct register, showing sensitivity to the text.
- 2) In addition, each candidate must play two organ pieces consisting of one piece by Bach and one by either a nineteenth century Romantic or twentieth century Contemporary composer. Total time 5–10 minutes.

College Age Students (ages 18–25)

- 1) Each candidate must play two hymns of his/her own choice with pedal in the correct register, showing sensitivity to the text.
- 2) In addition, each student must play three organ pieces—one each of a Baroque work, a nineteenth century Romantic, and a twentieth century Contemporary work. Total time 15–30 minutes.
