Cantor Newsletter, and five issues per year of Pastoral Music. We continue with certification programs for cantors, for pianists, and for organists in conjunction with the American Guild of Organists (AGO), as well as numerous other programming offerings.

We cannot deny the challenges we continue to experience around total membership numbers, as well as the financial state of our organization. I thank and commend Jennifer Kluge for her diligence and tenacity in dealing with both of these challenges of organizational life. The Board of Directors, along with our Executive Director, are accountable to you for both the stewardship of NPM's resources and for fulfilling the mission of NPM over the past year.

We are deeply grateful to all of our donors, no matter the size of their donation to NPM. I encourage you, the members, to keep spreading the good news! Tell your fellow music ministers about NPM. Invite them to join, and bring them with you to Kansas City for our next National Convention.

FORUM REPORTS

ADVOCACY & AFFILIATION FORUM

Lena Gokelman, Chair

The work of the Advocacy & Affiliation Forum is divided among leadership subgroups that have attempted to address the needs of the pastoral areas that comprise the Forum. In 2023, the Forum began the process of forming a Technology subgroup. The Composers subgroup made an effort to more clearly define the role of the Association in meeting the needs of members desiring more formation in composition; the team emphasized the important relationship between the art of composition and a foundational understanding of the theological and liturgical principles of worship, discussing possible ways this formation could take place,

and specific groups that might benefit from it. The Music Education subgroup engaged in early-stage visioning of a collaborative compilation of liturgical hymns of varying styles and cultures that could dually serve the liturgical/academic year and reinforce core musical competencies at various grade levels. In order to reach new members, the Religious Communities subgroup developed a survey that will be used to poll religious communities of men and women (and those who work with religious communities) about their specific needs in liturgy and music. Finally, the Clergy subgroup worked on a clergy formation day to take place during the NPM National Convention in Kansas City this summer.

CULTURAL DIVERSITY FORUM

During 2023, Cultural Diversity Forum leadership participated in several activities to educate membership on being a culturally diverse Church, including presenting podcasts during Black History Month (February), Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month (May), and Hispanic Heritage Month (September 15-October 15). The Forum also proposed, organized, and presented several sessions at the 2023 National Convention, such as the in-person panel discussion "Serving Servants: Ministering Ministers in a Multicultural Setting" and the virtual breakout

presentation "Whose Table? Sharing God's Banquet of Love, *Pagsasalo sa Hapag*." The Cultural Diversity Forum participated in Forum Chair and National Council meetings and in the search for new NPM Board members in an effort to diversify the Board of Directors. The Cultural Diversity Forum worked to establish and strengthen liaisons with other Forums, especially Communications and Programming; gathered information on members' Triduum celebrations and multicultural worship aids; and worked to keep the lines of communications open with worship offices and chapter directors.

CERTIFICATION FORUM

Stephen Obarski, Chair

NPM offers certification in three areas: cantor, organ, and piano. There are three divisions in cantor certification: Basic, Intermediate, and Colleague. Basic has the greatest number of participants. The Forum is in conversation about strategies to encourage more cantors who have attained Basic certification to continue their certification journey by pursuing Intermediate certification as well. We have had six cantors complete Colleague certification, with their liturgy essays enabling them to pass solidly.

There are also three divisions for organist certification: Basic, Service Playing, and Colleague. The latter two are administered primarily by the American Guild of Organists with collaboration from NPM. Amanda Bruce has met several times with her counterpart in the AGO to participate in mutual efforts between the

organizations to bolster the numbers of those seeking certification. Several Colleague candidates are in the midst of completing their certification, having already passed their performance portions.

At the moment, we have several candidates for Basic piano certification. The Forum has plans to examine the current standards and exam rubrics for both Intermediate and Colleague piano certification and promote participation at those levels.

For those seeking to take the essay portion of the Colleague-level cantor and organ requirements, Dr. Frank Klose has been assigning individual mentors to candidates to help them prepare. The mentors' work has been exemplary! The Forum is considering expanding this service to other aspects of certification.

COMMUNICATIONS FORUM

The NPM Communications Forum includes memberleaders from California to Massachusetts and from Michigan to the southern border of Texas. In 2023, the Forum gathered for four meetings via Zoom. At these meetings, the Forum engaged in prayer, brainstorming of content ideas for NPM publications, and frank and helpful discussions of NPM policies with regard to everything from Convention advertising to email frequency. One highlight of the Communications Forum's work was its development and release of the new NPM Style Guide, a dynamic document that helps streamline the writing and editing of our publications, making our communication more consistent across the Association. The Forum also provided feedback and insights about NPM's new member management and social media platform, The Music Room, which resulted in new programming aimed to help our members better utilize the platform. In addition, throughout 2023, Forum members served as convention moderators, consultants, editors, proof-readers, and beta-testers for NPM's many offerings, helping the Association communicate smoothly, clearly, and in a way that inspires our members.

DIRECTORS OF MUSIC MINISTRIES FORUM

Henry Bauer, Chair

The DMM Forum leadership committee proposed several breakouts, concerts, a retreat, and networking opportunities for the 2024 Convention in Kansas City. Many of their proposals were accepted, including a retreat for spiritual renewal and finding balance as pastoral musicians. The leadership committee also developed a list of short- and long-term goals for the Forum. They have generated many ideas for programs we can offer our members.

Subcommittees of the DMM Forum have completed various tasks and developed ideas for future work. The Advanced Liturgical/Theological Scholarship

subcommittee has compiled a list, which will be posted on the NPM website, of universities and colleges that offer programs in liturgy, theology, and liturgical music. The Professional Concerns subcommittee has done an extensive revision of "A Handbook and Guide for Hiring a Director of Music Ministries," which is due to come out this spring. The Advanced Musical Skills subcommittee has been organized, composed of musicians specializing in conducting, organ, voice, piano, and guitar. Its focus is to develop programs for improving the musical skills of pastoral musicians. They have drafted a list of new certifications that NPM may offer. A sub-subcommittee has been formed to develop a curriculum and certification program for organists and pianists.

FINANCE & DEVELOPMENT FORUM

The Finance & Development Forum is charged with assisting in the financial development of the Association, including the annual fund and other new initiatives. We also serve as a resource to the Board and the Executive Director on all fiscal matters. This past year the Forum has been working hard to develop a robust team focused on specific goals. In 2023, the Finance & Development Forum supported our annual ONE NPM campaign in collaboration with NPM National Staff, adding new components like the successful matching campaign, specific goals for Giving Tuesday, and an "In gratitude for" campaign where

members were encouraged to donate in gratitude for or in memory of someone who brought them into music ministry. When you review the Donor Roll, you will see how many members and friends supported NPM with their financial kindness this past year. NPM remains committed to treating members and non-members with dignity and respect. As part of that commitment, we have developed a Code of Ethical Behavior approved by the Board of Directors on January 30, 2023.

The Code is required to be published annually in *Pastoral Music* and can be found at *npm.org*.

NPM CODE OF ETHICAL BEHAVIOR

Approved 1/30/21

The National Association of Pastoral Musicians (NPM) is dedicated to fostering the art of musical liturgy. The association exists to assist the Catholic Church in the United States to sing the praise of God through divinely inspired musical worship. (See Ends Policies.)

NPM members, member leaders, and all who represent the association, including event speakers and presenters, agree to the following ethical standards which are essential to our mission in the Church and the world.

THE PARTIES NAMED ABOVE WILL:

Respect the dignity of every human person, regardless of race, national origin, age, religious affiliation, gender identity, marital status, sexual orientation, socioeconomic or educational background, disability, or medical condition.

Maintain appropriate relationships with fellow members, supervisors, colleagues, volunteers, and parishioners of all ages, avoiding any sort of abusive behavior.

Follow all appropriate and pertinent USCCB and diocesan policies, as well as legal statutes, regarding the reporting of abuse and protection of victims.

Acknowledge and respect the diversity of the Church and aim to share with, collaborate with, and serve persons of all cultural backgrounds.

Work toward a more just world for every person, especially those who are marginalized in any way.

Collaborate with clergy, staff, and volunteers, addressing differences of opinion through appropriate channels.

Commit to ongoing, lifelong education in the development of musical, liturgical, and pastoral skills.

Respect intellectual property rights by being aware of and complying with copyright law and attendant procedures regarding reproduction and performing rights.

Be responsible stewards of the association resources with which they have been entrusted.

Respect the employment rights of others, including incumbent musicians, and be aware of and comply with all laws and procedures pertaining to immigration and work permits.

Refrain from harming the reputations of colleagues and maintain professionalism in their use of social media.

Observe both the spirit and the letter of this Code of Ethical Behavior in their dealings with NPM, with individual members, with the musicians under their supervision, with colleagues, employing institutions, and the communities they serve.

Board members, Forum chairs, regional council representatives, and all contracted speakers are required to sign this policy. The policy is available on the NPM website, and published annually in *Pastoral Music* for the general membership. Reports of violations are made to the Board of Directors, which reserves the right to take appropriate action, including but not limited to the cancellation of membership and speaker contracts.
