The NPM Cantor Certificate Committee has developed a certificate process for Cantors to recognize the progression of acquired skills of Cantors serving Roman Catholic parishes.

The Cantor Colleague Certificate marks the third stage in the NPM Cantor Certificate program, recognizing the achievement of the *advanced* skills expected of cantors.

All certificate levels presume an understanding of the spirituality of this important ministry.

NPM Cantor Colleague Certificate Requirements

Test Process

The test process for the Cantor Colleague Certificate has three components. *Each* component must have a passing score of 70%.

1. Vocal Technique and Skills: the candidate will sing the following:
 - Sing two responsorial psalms **from the approved list** (below)—one setting chosen from List A (Chant) and one chosen from List B (Melodic) provided below
 - The sequence for Easter, Pentecost, or Corpus Christi (a chant setting)
 - Sight sing a short Gospel Acclamation and a standard chant psalm (Refrain, Verse One, Refrain) provided at the adjudication.
2. Applied Knowledge
The candidate will complete a written exam demonstrating familiarity with intermediate applied concepts in music theory and an understanding of the ministry of the cantor/psalmist.
3. Liturgical Knowledge
The candidate will complete a written exam on liturgy and its musical components. The test is administered online twice each year, in mid-January and mid-June. Successful completion of the exam requires extensive study and preparation over a period of several weeks. Candidates will be assigned a mentor to assist them in this process.

Application Process

Eligibility

All members of NPM who have completed *both* the NPM Basic Cantor Certificate, and the NPM Intermediate Cantor Certificate (ICC) are eligible to apply for the Cantor Colleague Certificate (CCC). Non-members may apply for membership when applying for the certificate.

Procedures

1. Complete the application form and return it with a non-refundable \$75 (members) and \$114 (non-members) processing fee to NPM-CCC, 962 Wayne Avenue, Suite 550, Silver Spring, MD 20910-4461.

2. Upon receipt of your application and payment of fee, you will be contacted by a member of the CCC Examination Committee who will provide further instructions.

Note: All adjudications (live or recorded) and exams must be completed within one year of the date on which your application is received.
