## FORUM REPORTS

#### Advocacy & Affiliation Forum

The Advocacy & Affiliation Forum is organized by members' shared pastoral roles, responsibilities, and interests (i.e., clergy, religious communities, youth, young adults, campus ministry, diocesan directors, composers, pastoral liturgy, technology, and music educators) for the purposes of networking, formation, and skills training. The Forum's work not only centers around advocating for the needs of those who identify with the pastoral roles named above, but also determines professional and ministerial affiliations which benefit specific areas of the Forum and the Association at large. The Forum's leadership team includes laypersons, clergy, religious, young and seasoned adults, volunteers, and professionals who represent many of the areas mentioned above.

An important charge for the Advocacy & Affiliation Forum is to directly engage members in the organizational life and work of the Association through their gifts of time and talent. Conversations during the past year have addressed questions about history and vision, identified needs and potential leaders within the section, and asked what NPM and its members have done well and have struggled to do. In 2021, a hefty list of concerns, accomplishments, and items for continued discussion was compiled. In addition, the Forum identified a working list of other member organizations that could potentially provide beneficial information, insight, and perspective and encourage fresh approaches to our operations.

Also in 2021, the Forum established a communication space for forum documents that will be accessible to future leaders, held consultative meetings about initiating respectful dialogue with various cultural groups, worked on a campus ministry retreat, expanded clergy connections and input with regard to NPM, formed subcommittees, and worked on a survey for those who have identified interest in this Forum at any level.

#### Communications Forum

Perhaps the most important work of the NPM Communications Forum so far has been our formation. Our members come from backgrounds in print media, podcasting, public speaking, graphic design, and more—all in addition to their work as pastoral musicians. Our NPM members have a wealth of experience and talent in communications and use their experience and aptitude for the ever-changing and ever-expanding communications field!

These talented, experienced members have come together to share their perspectives with NPM, bolstering its communications infrastructure and offering ideas on how to make it better. We are particularly interested in assisting NPM chapters with their communication needs. The Forum has generated ideas resulting in articles in NPM print publications, content for our digital offerings, and much more. One of our members gave a helpful tour of NPM's new website at our last Annual Members' Meeting.

The Communications Forum meets four times a year, with additional working meetings by smaller groups as necessary, and interfaces with the NPM staff in the work of engaging member voices in the Association's communications infrastructure, in order to help NPM fulfill its mission (fostering the art of musical liturgy) in new and innovative ways.

#### **Cultural Diversity Forum**

The Cultural Diversity Forum assures that programs, services, and policies reflect the cultural and ethnic diversity of the Church. In executing this overarching goal, the Forum engages in outreach with other organizations who represent pastoral musicians of diverse cultures, ensures the proper formation of NPM leadership in intercultural competence, and encourages and mentors members of diverse cultures to become involved in forums and consider assuming leadership roles.

The success of the Cultural Diversity Forum depends on all members to guide one another. The Forum listens, responds, and acts with kindness and compassion. Together, we will conquer fear with calm, awareness over ignorance, and dialogue over disregard, with the ultimate goal of diversity being a natural part of NPM's work.

## Director of Music Ministries (DMM) Forum

The Director of Music Ministries (DMM) Forum focuses on "pastoral musicians who hold or share the primary responsibility for musical leadership in parish, diocesan, and other church institutions." The Forum's general responsibilities are to provide networking opportunities; to develop means for advanced skill training; to attend to our spirituality through retreats and other moments for personal prayer and reflection; to provide advanced liturgical, theological, and musical scholarship; to counsel on employment practices; and to mentor musicians new to the field of music ministry. Dr. Henry "Hank" Bauer has served as chair since September 2021. Under Hank's leadership, the Forum has focused on networking and mentorship, advanced music skill training, spirituality

for musicians, and advanced liturgical and theological scholarship. Additional leadership team members are sought.

Future projects include increasing networking opportunities, creating means to share information and ask questions, and more advanced skill training. Ways to make the Choral Anthem Project more userfriendly and informative are being developed through Liturgy Help's partnership with NPM on its planning calendar, such as including links to recordings and links for ordering or downloading the music, and providing a direct breakdown of which pieces correlate to the various parts of the Mass (i.e., Entrance Antiphon, First Reading, etc.).

#### Musical Skills Forum

The Musical Skills Forum assists in the development of formation and skills training for various musical disciplines. Members were recruited to the leadership team to oversee the various areas of this new forum. These six leadership team members have worked on the areas of vocal, choral conducting, organ, piano, and compositional skills. Our first task was to identify the musical skills needed by liturgical musicians for each area of interest. Detailed lists of these skills were generated, which are now the basis for our continued work.

In 2021, the Forum began a long-term, ongoing project of creating short video lessons intended to help the membership develop and improve these musical skills. Topics have included basic information on tempi, breathing, choral warm-ups, and wellness. New videos on a wider variety of topics are being planned and will be created or overseen by the Forum leadership and added at least quarterly. The video library is housed on the NPM website and is accessible to all NPM members at the Standard and Premium level.

Upcoming plans include surveying the members who have shown interest in our Forum. From this survey we hope to glean information about musical skills that the membership wishes to improve, as well as interest from members who might be willing to serve as teachers. The Forum hopes to create a regional list of available teachers as another resource for those seeking one-on-one guidance to improve their musicianship.


# MEMBERSHIP

he Membership Forum has been working hard to spread the word about NPM. In 2021, we looked for opportunities to gain new members and worked with the National Office on strategies to regain members who had let their membership lapse. The forum actively sought to revitalize chapters that had been dormant and worked to make connections with members that could establish brand new chapters. We had particular success in helping to establish a chapter in the Diocese of Orange, CA, as well as making solid inroads toward the establishment of chapters in the Diocese of San Bernardino, CA, and the Diocese of Fresno, CA.



Behind the scenes, the forum has been working diligently on revamping the Chapter Handbook. This document is critical for all of our chapters across the country, as it will replace any and all existing chapter bylaws with a national standard. As we move forward into 2022, the Membership Forum welcomes ideas about how to strengthen awareness of the value of NPM, particularly in dioceses that do not currently have a strong NPM membership presence.

# PROGRAMMING & CERTIFICATION

he Programming and Certification Forum has been hard at work in 2021. Certification has brought all forms of NPM Certification under one umbrella. (They were previously split over three different Interest Sections and three different National Committees.) This work positions NPM to standardize the certification processes and grow this valuable membership benefit. Subcommittees have been formed where appropriate to assist in the administration of specific instrument group certificates.

The Programming arm has developed a vast and diverse leadership team to support and grow NPM's programming. This central leadership team includes local leaders from past, current, and future national conventions and seeks to build institutional programmatic knowledge and experience within the volunteer leadership. The leadership team also includes other at-large members. Subcommittees have been formed to work specifically on the Liturgical Life of NPM Programming and on the Premium Members Colloquium. Current work includes re-imaging the convention planning process in a cohesive and collaborative way, as well as responding to the needs of all our members by developing additional forms of programming beyond our national Convention, held each summer.

In total, over 30 people are actively serving on five different committees within the Programming and Certification Forum.

# SOCIAL MEDIA & TECHNOLOGY

Throughout 2021, technology allowed NPM to stay connected to our ministers and the Church at large. NPM stayed strong in this area by continuing to offer the Lunchtime Concert Series and Thursday Thoughts at 3, which started in 2020.

We hosted our most popular Thursday Thoughts at 3, "Our Legs Uttered Songs," a three-part series reflecting on Black Catholic leaders in our Church's history. The first episode alone received over 1,000 views on our YouTube channel, the most views of any of our videos in the first seven days of release.

The Lunchtime Concert Series continues to be a popular way to connect with fellow pastoral musicians and to enjoy music on our Wednesday lunch break. NPM was proud to host multiple virtual choir showcases in 2021, celebrating the many choirs across the country (and the world) who worked harder than ever to sing with one another, even when public singing was limited.

NPM also hosted its Annual Members' Meeting virtually in 2021, giving all members the chance to attend the yearly "State of the Union" for the association. About 400 members attended the live event or watched the replay.

NPM's Ministry Monday podcast saw a sharp increase in topics and speakers. Popular mini-series topics included music and technology, navigating the public domain, Gregorian chant, and the singing priest. NPM also began to regularly offer the podcast in video format this year, which increased visibility of the podcast (and NPM) on YouTube.




