Scope and Sequence for NPM Cantor Certificates

Please note that the musical, spiritual and liturgical components of these certificates are essential and interrelated aspects of the standards and requirements. Candidates are expected to engage in thoughtful, prayerful preparation and formation in all of these areas whether they are professional musicians or volunteers. For this reason, all candidates must start with the BCC and may apply for only one certificate at a time.

Also note that the cantor certificate process is intended for adult cantors. Cantors younger than age 18 who wish to pursue the Basic Cantor Certificate and who are prepared to meet <u>all</u> of the expectations must contact the certificate administrator to discuss the possibility of being considered for the process.

Candidates are responsible for consulting the Study Guides on the NPM website.
